2. Fostering Racial and Societal Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

How can CECE members build economic and community engagement partnerships that contribute to honest, intentional, and authentic racial and social diversity, equity, and inclusion on campus and in the communities universities serve?

What are best practices for fostering lasting, reciprocal partnerships around equity and inclusion and how do you leverage these practices regionally and within your institution?

3. <u>Strategically Leveraging Across CECE Efforts to Foster Talent, Innovation ecosystems, and Place</u> <u>Development and Community Engagement</u>
