Michigan State University has long had a presence in Metro Detroit through its strong regional programming and large numbers of alumni residing in Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties.

The MSU Detroit Center, located on Woodward Avenue, in the heart of Detroit, is a hub for an array of community programs, research activities, and special events that facilitate the university's engagement in SE Michigan. The 22,000-square-foot facility is housed in the historic Albert Kahn Building. It is available for use by MSU-related groups/units, university partners, and other community organizations.

MSU offers practical support to community development by creating collaborative partnerships among a broad range of disciplines and with external constituents. Several university-based programs operate out of the MSU Detroit Center.

Provides services and programs designed to engage students and parents interested in opportunities for higher education, particularly undergraduate freshman and transfer students

MSU Detroit Early Honors Experience is an opportunity for Detroit Public Schools Community District's rising eighth and ninth grade students to explore their city in a new way with hands-on exploration of arts, technology, and sciences. The program, for gifted and talented youth, helps students build college readiness, connect with other students, and meet MSU faculty, staff, and students.
