

Dual enrollment is an opportunity for students in Grades 9.5 to 12 to enroll in select undergraduate courses at **Michigan State University while** in high school.

Why Choose Dual Enrollment?

Students choose dual enrollment because they:

- Are interested in exploring an elective not available to them at their home school
- Have exhausted the advanced course options in their high school
- Are nearing the end of their high school career and want to take an introductory course to determine whether to pursue that area of study in college

Whatever the motivation, dual enrollment at MSU is a great way for students to acclimate themselves to collegiate studies.

Eligibility

- U.S.-based students in Grades 9.5 to 12 must have completed at least one full semester (five classes) of high school before applying.
 Student applications must include an official high school transcript reflecting a qualifying GPA.
- Students must be enrolled in at least one class at their home high school.
- Students must have a 3.0 GPA or above.

Students may not attend MSU as a dual enrollment student during the summer after they complete high school.

Courses

Dual enrollment (DE) students may only choose from undergraduate courses on the designated course list. Courses not on the list are not available to DE students regardless of circumstance.

Application

Plan Ahead: Applications will be accepted no later than 4 weeks prior to the semester's start date to ensure that your application will be processed in time for you to enroll.

MSU and the Dual Enrollment staff do not guarantee enrollment in any course. Please be aware of any prerequisites listed with the course description. Higher level courses usually require prerequisites.

Cost

Students in Dual Enrollment pay MSU tuition at the in-state undergraduate rate. DE course tuition is not eligible for discounts, nor are DE students eligible for scholarships, endowments, grants, or financial aid provided to MSU students. DE students are also not eligible for course fee courtesy provided to MSU faculty and staff.
