EAST LANSING, Mich. – The 2016 MSU Science Festival schedule of events is now available, and includes a multi-day series of events that highlight science, technology, engineering, arts, and math (STEAM). Special events are slated across Michigan with a concentration of activities in the East Lansing and Detroit areas.
