EAST LANSING, Mich. – Two MSU programs and 23 students have been awarded the national Presidential Volunteer Service Award (PVSA) for completing 100 or more hours of volunteer service within a one-year time frame during the 2014-2015 academic year.

The PVSA awards are an initiative of the Corporation for National and Community Service, and administered by Points of Light, the largest organization in the world dedicated to public service.

MSU's Center for Service-Learning and Civic Engagement (CSLCE) became an official PVSA Certifying Organization in 2015. For nearly 50 years, CSLCE has worked to advance community engaged learning, and prepare students for lifelong civic and social responsibility in an increasingly diverse and complex global society.

Attention MSU Students: Record Your 2015-2016 Volunteer Service Hours to Earn a Presidential Volunteer Service Award

MSU students can record their 2015-2016 volunteer service hours before 5 p.m. on Thursday, June 30 for eligibility in the 2015-2016 Presidential Volunteer Service Awards.

MSU's PVSA application process is fairly simple: 1) create a personal account on <u>GiveGab</u>, (<u>www.givegab.com</u>), 2) join the MSU Community on GiveGab (<u>msu.givegab.com</u>), and 3) log at least 100 volunteers hours by 5:00pm on June 30th, 2016.
