EAST LANSING, Mich. –The State Tournament of the Michigan Science Olympiad will be held on Saturday, April 28, 2012 at Michigan State University in East Lansing.

More than 450 high school and middle school teams competed at regional competitions during February and March, resulting in 96 teams selected to compete at the state tournament. Students will participate in 46 competitive events held in various locations on the MSU campus. Forensics, gravity, remote sensing, aquifers, quantitative data capture, bottle rockets, food science, robotics, towers, forestry, astronomy, and experimental design are among the broad range of scientific topics that students address during the competitive challenges.

This year marks the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Michigan Science Olympiad, part of an international event that is one of the premier science competitions for middle school and high school youth across the United States. Aimed at increasing student interest in science and recognizing outstanding achievement in science education by students and teachers, Science Olympiad tournaments are rigorous academic competitions that consist of a series of team events for which students and their coaches and volunteers prepare during the entire year. In Michigan, participation has increased from 600 students in the first event thirty years ago to over two million currently.

State Champions and runner-up teams from each division will compete in the National Science Olympiad Tournament at the University of Central Florida in Orlando, May 18-19, 2012.

"We are honored to host the Michigan Science Olympiad State Tournament, made possible by generous support from the Dart Foundation, and we are working to make this another significant experience for the nearly 3,000 participants involved," says Hiram E. Fitzgerald, Associate Provost for University Outreach and Engagement.

"These student scientists, along with their coaches, teachers, parents, and volunteers, represent a strong dedication to scientific concepts, process skills, and applications, and (continued....)
