2023 MSU Detroit Center Initiatives (UOE)

Strategic Partnerships

Apple Developer Academy

- The MSU Detroit Center Director, along with the MSU Director for Workforce and Economic Development Partnerships, has been involved with the outreach and engagement of community partners as a result of the launch of the MSU Detroit-based Apple Developer Academy announced in January 2021 as a part of MSU's relationship with Apple and MSU's success with the iOS Design Lab on campus.
- The MSU Detroit Center Director has continued to provide student support resource referrals to the Apple Developer Academy to address critical needs for students enrolled in the program. (3.1; 5.5)

Honors College Partnership

UOE GATE and the MSU Detroit Center have been in discussion about ways to develop capacity and a pipeline and on ramp for prospective students and students from underrepresented areas to participate in the Honors College and gifted and talented opportunities. Along with MSU units, the Detroit Public Schools Community District – Senior Director of Gifted and Talented Education, have launched plans to develop a summer intensive pilot (Summer 2023) to identify and engage gifted students from Detroit. The Honors College will facilitate the intensive hosted at the MSU Detroit Center. Other initiatives are also a part of the discussion to expand the reach and diversity of Honors College prospects. (Student Success, Obj. 1 & 3; DEI Obj. 5))

Community-Engaged Research and Supports

Urban Leadership and Learning Collaborative (in affiliation with Focus: HOPE and Hope Village Revitalization)

- MSU is one of the three university partners (along with Wayne State University & the University of Michigan) involved in the development of the Urban Learning and Leadership Collaborative. The vision of the collaborative is to be the collaborative platform for the HOPE Village Initiative, where local knowledge and university resources mesh to create innovative solutions to community challenges.
- MSU continues to support this effort through staff participation on the Core Team, submission of related grant funding opportunities and in the continued vetting of research partnerships hoping to engage the Hope Village community in its research endeavors.
- In 2022, the ULLC continued the work of D-STOPP, a Spencer Foundation grant funded initiative, to develop community/youth/university team partnerships to design interventions meant to address different aspects of the school to prison pipeline. Dr. Camille Wilson (UM) was selected as the ULLC Principal Investigator to lead this project. The project culminated with a sharing of the small team interventions with the larger community in July 2022.
- Fostered faculty connections with Dr. Stacey Missmer and the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Biology relationships to support research and Detroit community education about and recruitment to the W.O.R.K (Pelvic Pain) Study. April 2022 (3.1; 3.2)

Outreach and Engagement Activities (e.g., Community-Based Education) and Infrastructure (e.g., Science Festival)

UOE Youth Mental Health Forum

Co –created and facilitated a virtual Youth Mental Health Forum held Saturday, June 18th that addressed the mental health challenges that children, teens and young adults have faced due to the COVID-19 pandemic. It was meant to provide strategies and tips that parents, professionals and youth could utilize to build resilience and positively impact coping skills. MSU-DOE Plant Research Laboratory

- Engaged with PRL faculty to develop youth focus groups to address diversity, equity and inclusion concerns and to develop youth research pipeline
- Connected MSU-DOE PRL with Detroit Area Pre-College Engineering Program (DAPCEP) and Detroit Public Schools Community District (DPSCD) STEM Program to develop relationships for youth engagement
- The MSU-DOE PRL continues to offer pre-college visits to East Lansing for DAPCEP
 Students and with the assistance of the newly formed faculty Community Building and
 Outreach Committee, is seeking to expand their efforts to develop a youth pipeline of
 diverse students interested in plant biology and research careers. The committee is

currently developing plans for a summer research seminar at the MSU Detroit Center to attract students from throughout SE Michigan.

National Library of Medicine Outreach Library Advisory Committee - Wayne State University Shiffman Library

- The MSU Detroit Center continues to serve as a collaborative partner in this initiative led by WSU's Shiffman Medical Library (which serves as a National Library of Medicine Outreach Library) in partnership with several community and academic partners.
- Co-presented conference session entitled Academic Community Partnerships for Health Advancement at the 2022 Internet Librarian Conference held in Monterey, CA October 20th, 2022 to share lessons from a decade long partnership to disseminate trusted health information to populations disproportionately impacted by lack of access to quality information and health care. (Sustainable Health Obj. 2)

Hope Village Collaborative

- The MSU Detroit Center is a long-time supporter and collaborator with the Hope Village community, as represented by Hope Village Revitalization (HVR) and Hope Village residents and friends. The MSU Detroit Center has supported collaboration efforts which include planning and promotion of: the Hope Village Farmer's Market; Detroit Horsepower program site design; Neighborhood Health Promotion activities (Citizenship for Health) and the MSHDA Neighborhood Enhancement Program.
- In the 2022 MSHDA NEP effort the MSU Detroit Center Director served as an evaluator for the disbursement of more than \$100,000.00 to support neighborhood blight elimination for approximately 30 residents of the Hope Village neighborhood. Grants of up to \$5000. (and in some cases \$7400) for exterior repairs and improvements were awarded to eligible Hope Village residents.

MINT Artists Guild

A partnership developed with youth serving non-profit Mint Artists Guild in June 2022
to support the training and entrepreneurship of youth artists interested in pursuing
careers in the visual arts. The MSU Detroit Center is host to a youth art exhibition, an
opening reception and will host a non-profit Giving Breakfast in January 2023 to
support paid internships, youth artists in residence and future non-profit
collaborations. The Exhibition and other activities are a part of MINT's Paint Detroit
with Generosity Initiative that grants the work of youth artists to various local nonprofits. (DEI Obj. 5)
