2016-17 MSU Detroit Center Initiatives (UOE)

MSU Detroit Center Pre-College Programs Open Houses – The MSU Detroit Center continues to host Pre-College Open Houses (College Readiness Expos) that continue to grow in attendance and demand for information. Multiple MSU colleges and units participated in the open houses including: Admissions, Agriculture and Natural Resources, Community Music School-Detroit, Osteopathic Medicine, Education, GATE and MSU Extension – 4H. The events are designed to provide outreach and information about Spartan Pre-College Summer Youth Programs on campus.

MSU in the 313 Pre-College Summer Experience Scholarship Fund – UOE and the MSU Detroit Center has continued its fundraising efforts to scholarships to low- and moderate-income families wishing to participate in MSU Pre-College Summer Youth Programs on campus that require participation fees. The Campaign originally launched in February 2015 for thirty days

with a fundraising goal of \$2500. Corporate donations allowed the campaign to raise over \$5000 for distribution to eligible scholarship applicants.

MSU Science Festival Detroit 2016

UOE and the MSU Detroit Center hosted the second year of the MSU Science Festival expansion in Detroit with a week of scheduled activities designed to celebrate and explore the role of science in our everyday lives. MSU Detroit Center partnered with area cultural institutions and community venues to host Ted-style talks, tours, adult science cafés and hands-on experiences emphasizing science, technology, engineering, art and mathematics (STEAM). The week culminated with and Exposition Day on Belle Isle Park at the Belle Isle Nature Zoo, Detroit Historical Society's Dossin Great Lakes Museum and Belle Isle Conservancy's Belle Isle Aquarium. The events attracted over 5000 participants and volunteers to learn, explore and celebrate STEAM professionals, careers and organizations.

Detroit Public Television

The MSU Detroit Center served as the site for a half day workshop designed for DPTV and its partners to explore the potential of Digital Badging meant to enhance the value and encourage the exploration of hands-on learning activities within community-based settings. The MSU Detroit Center also hosted the media event announcing the partnership between MSU and DPTV on a long-term children's programming and educational initiative that includes a 24 hour Children's Channel.

ULLC Focus: HOPE – MSU is one of the three research university partners (along with Wayne State University & the University of Michigan) involved in the development of the Urban Learning and Leadership Collaborative. The vision of the collaborative is: To be the collaborative platform for the HOPE Village Initiative, where local knowledge and university resources mesh to create innovative solutions to community challenges. MSU continues to support this effort through staff participation on the Core Team and is in the infrastructure development and funding phase of the project.

MSU Extension

UOE supports the work of Wayne County's 4H Youth in Governance programs at both the MSU Detroit Center and Partnerships Office at Franklin Wright Settlements: Summer goLEAD Camp experience, STEAM Camp, Health & Nutrition Workshops, Parent & Child Socialization Groups and both 4H Volunteer Training, 4H Teen Detroit Food Project Leaders and Youth Leadership Retreats.

Henry Ford Health System Midtown Circle of Care Collaborative

UOE and MSU-Detroit are members of the Midtown Circle of Care. Circles of Care are educational programs offered by The Interfaith Health & Hope Coalition, a collaboration of organizations committed to the holistic well-being of the Southeast Michigan Community. Circles of Care was created to engage faith-based congregations, health systems, social service agencies and others to help develop and expand small networks that serve as partnerships in health education and wellness.

Detroit Komen Race for the Cure

The MSU Detroit Center has been a continuing partner with the Detroit Komen Race for the Cure and participates in the annual Komen Race for the Cure by providing Race Planning Committee support and hosting community grant workshops. Additionally, UOE staff provides assistance in the development and compilation of the *Komen Detroit Community Profile* deepening the knowledge of the state of breast cancer in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties. The Community Profile enables Komen Detroit to set the priorities for awareness, education and community grant making and serves as the comprehensive action plan for addressing screening and treatment needs among medically underserved women in highlighted communities in Southeast Michigan. UOE staff has also served on the Community Grant Panel to determine funding eligibility and funding levels for community grant applicants.

Detroit Wayne County Health Authority- (Michigan Organizations To Impact Obesity and Nutrition) MOTIONS Coalition – Michigan State University is a community partner in this effort to promote community education and health promotion and provide resources and interventions to the SE Michigan community to prevent obesity and poor nutrition.

National Library of Medicine Outreach Library Advisory Committee

The MSU Detroit Center is a collaborative partner in this initiative led by Wayne State University's Shiffman Medical Library (which serves as a National Library of Medicine Outreach Library) in partnership with several community and academic partners. The Advisory committee has supported Detroit's World AIDS Day activities, various educational seminars and exhibits focusing on health disparities including the 2016 "**How Does Your Garden Grow?**" focused on Urban Agriculture and Health and plans for offering a future exhibition on confronting violence toward women.

Henry Ford Health System, Institute of Multicultural Health – Latino Health Stakeholders

UOE supports the work of the HFHS Latino Health Stakeholders Group in addressing barriers to access for both patients and employees (pipeline programs and initiatives). In 2016, this group hosted a Stakeholders Breakfast with elected officials and a ½ day Latino Health Symposium at the Margherio Center at Wayne State University's School of Medicine.

Black Business Pioneers Film Screening

UOE and the MSU Detroit Center hosted a Black History Month program featuring a documentary by local filmmaker Anthony Brogdon. The program featured a screening of Black Business Pioneers of Detroit – Paradise Valley and Hastings Street. Panel guests included former Paradise Valley residents and local author/historian Ken Coleman.

Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers - Detroit Chapter

The MSU Detroit Center hosted meetings of the Detroit Chapter of SHPE with an emphasis on expanding professional membership in the organization and providing STEM awareness, support access and development of their membership, as well as youth mentorship.

MSU Extension – UOE has supported the work of Wayne County's 4H Youth in Governance programs at both the MSU Detroit Center and Partnerships Office at YouthVille Detroit, Summer

goLEAD Camp experience, Health & Nutrition Workshops, Parent & Child Socialization Groups and both 4H Volunteer Training and Youth Leadership Retreats.

MSU School of Social Work

UOE and the Partnerships Office at Franklin Wright Settlements continues to support the Detroit-based research team working collaboratively with agencies and organizations serving individuals at the intersections of the mental health, substance abuse, and the criminal justice systems. School of Social Work faculty specializes in the clinical and organizational processes associated with each of these systems. Providing a hands-on, informative approach to research and evaluation engages partner agencies and organizations in addressing critical research questions and guides positive change at both the individual- and systems-level.

Youth Development Resource Center (YDRC)

UOE, through the Partnerships Office at Franklin Wright Settlements has provided support to the Youth Development Alliance and the Skillman Foundation. YDRC supports Skillman-funded youth development programs in using data and learning to continually improve their programs. YDRC provides a set of capacity-building opportunities on how many students are participating in high-quality programs in six targeted neighborhoods.

BMe/My Brother's Keeper - BMe Community is a growing network of all races and genders committed to building better communities across the U.S. BMe is built upon Black fathers, coaches, businessmen and students who lead by example to strengthen neighborhoods, mentor young people, and create businesses. UOE and the MSU Detroit Center continue to provide support and meeting/event space and to engage in community dialogue with the BMe Community.

MSU Extension, Government and Public Policy Educator for the Greening Michigan Institute

UOE and the Partnerships Office at Franklin Wright Settlements hosts and supports MSU Extension's focus on developing capacity for local communities to position themselves for success in 21st century Michigan through partnerships between MSUE, local governments, community leaders and organizations in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties in the areas of land use planning, zoning, strategic planning, place-making, historical preservation and fiscal sustainability. With an emphasis on Southeast Michigan and distressed communities, statewide education duties of the Public Policy Educator include Planning and Zoning Workshops, New County Commissioner Trainings, New Economy and Place making Workshops, and Fiscal Sustainability workshops.

Detroit Area Pre College Engineering Program (DAPCEP) – UOE and the MSU Detroit Center has continued to provide support to and hosted multiple events with DAPCEP. A non-profit with 38 years of experience partnering with universities, training programs, and K-12 school systems in order to connect youth to the best science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) educational experiences in Michigan. DAPCEP aims to provide opportunities for growth and career development of future engineers and careers in STEM fields by cultivating interest and developing skills among students from underrepresented communities in southeast Michigan.

UOE supports DAPCEP through its Executive Board participation and funding support of ongoing programs and initiatives.

Detroit College Promise – UOE and the MSU Detroit Center has sponsored and hosted several programs through Detroit College Promise. The mission of The Detroit College Promise is to motivate Detroit students to make education a priority. DCP offers a universal scholarship for students in grades 9-12, good at any Michigan public college or university simply for attending a Detroit Public School, living in the city of Detroit and completing an on time application. DCP is an organization whose mission is provide college access to Detroit students, many of whom are from first generation and underrepresented communities.
